

THE COLLEGE COUNCIL

A College Council has been constituted to advice and assist the Principal in all activities of the college. The college council consists of the following members and all the regular faculty.

THE STAFF COUNCIL

A Staff Council consists of principal and all teachers of the college. It shall be the duty of the secretary to issue notice for the committee meeting and keep the record of proceedings.

THE IQAC

An internal quality assurance cell was established in the month of October 2015. The body consists of Principal, teachers, one member from the management, senior administrative Staff, one nominee each from local society & student alumni. The IQAC functions with innovative ideas for the future development of the college.

DEPARTMENT OF STUDENT SERVICES (DSS)

The DSS functions with the objective of promoting and co-ordinating social and cultural events for students. The department conducts wide range of activities like offering medical aid and group insurance for students, organisation of literary events etc.

PARENT - TEACHER ASSOCIATION

There shall be a Parent - Teacher Association to assist the faculty and the management for the smooth functioning of the college. The general body of the association comprises of all the members of the teaching faculty, members of the management committee and guardians of the students of the current academic year. The executive committee shall be instrumental in promoting creative and progressive functioning of the college and to undertake activities to benefit the college community. The P.T.A.

General Body meeting will be held after the completion of admission of a new batch. Budget presenation, election of the PTA Executive committee are kept as main agenda for the meeting. The PTA also contribute cash awards for the second topper of B.Ed. Degree examinations.

ALUMNI ASSOCIATON

One of the teaching staff members, elected by the executive committee will be the secretary for a term of five years. Principal is the President of the Association. The executive committee decide and implement various activities and programmes. The general body will nominate 3 members from old students and two members from teachers.

The activities start with a programme to welcome the students of the new batch in the month of re-opening every year.

The Association aims to conduct seminars, workshop, exhibitions and interactions with eminent persons which are very useful to the students.

COLLEGE UNION

Election of the College Union is held as per the rules and provisions contained in the notification issued by the M.G. University in this respect. All the elected members are expected to conduct their activities in such a manner as to bring laurels to the institution and provide effective leadership to the student community. The College Magzine is published once in a year and all the students are subscribers of the Magazine.

- 2. In all matters connected with the magazine, the decision of the Principal shall be final.

TUTORIAL SYSTEM

A group of 5-10 students will be assigned to a teacher who will be a tutor in charge of the group. Each group tutor will monitor the progress of the students under his/her charge. Tutorial group meetings will be held once in every week.

FACILITIES

LIBRARY

The college has a computerised library with resourceful collection of books and journals. We have a collection of nearly 13000 titles belonging to different disciplines. Moreover we have subscribed to nearly 30 journals and periodicals. The library shall remain open from 9.30 am to 4.30 pm on all working days.

A student will be permitted to take maximum three books at a time and should be returned within 14 days. A fine of Rs. 1/- per book per day shall be levied in the case of books not returned on the due date. sub lending of library books is not permissible. Reference books cannot be borrowed at any case.

If any book is damaged by or lost from any borrower he/ she should replace another copy of the book or pay three times the cost of the book. Specified days shall be allotted to each optional group so as to make it convenient to select and issue books. The books shall be issued only between 10 am and 1.00 pm and 1.30 pm and 4.30 pm on all every working days. Every student is expected to use the library to the maximum.

PHOTOCOPIER

Photocopying facility is available in the college office on moderate charges.

INTERNET

Wi-Fi access is available in the college campus. All the students can access internet facility available in the college.

LABORATORIES

Various laboratories such as computer lab, language lab, psychology lab and science laboratories function well in the college.

STUDENT HOSTEL

The college provides hostel facilities for girl students.

FEES / SCHOLARSHIPS & ENDOWMENT

TUITION FEE

The following are the fee the candidate has to remit

- a. Tuition fee is Rs. 2100/-
- b. Special fee is Rs. 1088/- which is to be paid during admission time. This will cover the fee for library, laboratary, stationary, calendar, etc
 - University affiliation fee Rs. 1200/-
- d. A caution deposit of Rs. 360/- shall be collected at the time of admission.

SCHOLARSHIP

University Merit Scholarship:- Students who have 60% or more marks for the qualifying examination are offered this scholarship during the course. This scholarship cannot be enjoyed with any other scholarship, it is purely a merit scholarship. Parents have to execute with the University a bond agreeing to refund the scholarship received in case the scholar discontiues studies before completing the course.

Blind students are eligible for government Scholarship. Students belonging to minority communities, SC/ST/OBC (non cremylayer), physically challenged & financially backward are also eligible for UGC scholarship.

National Scholarship

Students belonging to economically weaker section can register in the National Scholarship portal and avail scholarship.

PTA Cash Awards

- 1. An amount of Rs.2000/- is set apart for college topper in B.Ed. Degree Examination.
- 2. An amount of Rs.1500/- each will be given to the top scorers in each optional subject.
- 3. Cash prize will be given to those students who secure ranks in the University Examination.

Alumni Cash Awards

a) Rs. 1000 will be awarded to each optional student who secure IInd Place in the B.Ed Examination.

MERIT DAY

Merit day is celebrated in the second week of February and PTA scholarships and Alumni scholarships are given away to the top scorers and meritorious students.

EDUCATIONAL CONCESSION

Students belonging to Scheduled Caste / Scheduled Tribe classes - newly admitted as well as those continuing their studies - have to apply for educational concession including lumpsum grant,monthly stipend, tuition fees and examination fees in the prescribed form available in the college office.

RULES & REGULATIONS

The College timing is 9.30 a.m. to 3.30 p.m.

COLLEGE ASSEMBLY

Every Tuesday, the college starts functioning after an assembly. All students actively participate in the conduct of the assembly. Principal's address, speech, presentation of news etc. are the special features of the assembly.

THOUGHT FOR THE DAY & BOOK REVIEW

The routine work of the college starts with prayer followed by thought for the day & a book review.

ATTENDANCE

- 1. Absence in one period in a day will be counted as absence during that session.
- 2. Students are not allowed to leave a class without the permission of the teacher.
- 3. Unauthorised absence of a student for more than 15 consecutive working days will entail removal of his / her name from the rolls.
- 4. Leave application shall be submitted to the principal duly recommend by the class teacher.
- 5. The attendance of each student will be displayed on the notice board on a monthly basis. Semester wise attendance statement will be sent to the University.

A student shall be considered to have satisfactory attendance to appear for the examination if he/she attends not less than

80% of the working days for all the theory courses and practicum and 90% of the working days for 20 weeks (4+16) School Internship. Condonation of shortage of attendance shall be as per existing University statutes and rules. Candidates with shortage of attendance beyond the condonable limit will not be eligible to register for End Semester University Examination. In such cases the candidate has to repeat the programme/course by taking re- admission with the concurrence of the University. Condonation of attendance shall be limited to once during the entire programme.

All the courses carrying credits/grades should be compulsorily attended by all the candidates for the successful completion of the programme. Only such candidates are permitted to register for the End Semester University Examination.

Candidates who register his/her name for the End Semester University Examination for a semester will be eligible for promotion to the next semester.

A student who has completed the entire curriculum requirement, but could not register for the semester examination can register notionally for getting eligibility for promotion to the next semester subject to the concurrence of University.

All the practical works (Engagement with the field) related to all the courses have to be compulsorily completed by all the students to be eligible for appearing for the practical examination of the External Practical Board.

Students who are eligible/have attended the practical examinations of the External Practical Board, alone will be permitted to register for theory examinations

The students will be observed and appraised by the teaching faculty throughout the course period and periodic appraisal reports will be sent to the guardian. Internal assessment will mainly be based on the classroom observation, class tests & practicum works of students.

EXAMINATION

Besides the theory and practical examinations conducted by the university, there will be model examinations in all semesters which form one among the criteria for internal assessment. Moreover, class tests will be administered periodically as a part of formative evaluation.

GENERAL DISCIPLINE

- Students are expected to conduct themselves in accordance with the best standards of manners and behaviour in and out of the college.
- 2. Uniform is compulsory twice a week
 Students are requested to make as less noise as possible when they move from one class to another.
- 4. When a teacher enters a class, the students should rise and remain standing until he / she sits or desires them to resume their seats.
- 5. While a class is in progress no student shall enter or leave the class without the permission of the teacher.
- 6. Students are not allowed to walk in the varandhas and corridors of the college talking or laughing aloud during class hours. Students who have no work during any particular periods shall remain in the reading room /class room or in the waiting room as per prior instruction if any, by the concerned teachers.
- 7. Sudents shall handle all college property with care. They are not allowed to disfigure the walls, desks or benches with any writing or engravings. They shall not throw rubbish in the college premises. They are expected to bring lunch in tiffin carrier and not in packets.
- 8. No notice or appeal of any kind shall be circulated among the students or pasted on the notice board or any where within the college premises without the written consent of

- the Principal. Students are not allowed to organize or conduct meeting in the college or collect money for any purpose without the formal permission of the principal.
- 9. Smoking, Snuffing, chewing and consumption of alcohol are strictly prohibited within the college premises. Students are also forbidden to tuck up their dothies while in the college campus.
- 10. Students should not move mass petitions or represent themselves in group before the college authorities. At the same time they may submit representations individually to the Principal.
- 11. Students are not allowed to take part in any political agitation directed against the authority of government or in any movement or agiation of any kind which may be accompanied by or may result in ill feeling between different sections of the community or which tends to excite feelings or disloyalty or disaffection.
- 12. Irregular attendance, insubordination to teachers, habitual absence from class work, obsene behaviour and such other acts may be viewed seriously by the college.
- 13. The Principal is empowered to take appropriate disciplinary measures if need be against any student found guilty of serious misconduct or flouting the norms and regulations set by the institution, and the same will be intimated to the concerned parents and the syndicate of the university in due course of time.
- 14. An adverse entry on the conduct of a student in the confidential register may debar him from receiving a certificate of good conduct and character from the Principal.
- 15. Students should take note of notifications displayed in the notice boards frequently.
- 16. All the students of the college are required to carry their identity card with them. Failure to do so is punishable by fine.

CELLS, CLUBS AND ASSOCIATIONS

The institution has several cells, clubs & associations which function effectively to provide quality education and experience to the prospective teachers. The Principal shall be the ex - officio president of all associations. The Principal shall have powers to nominate faculty to act as advisers under whose guidance the association shall be conducted fruitfully.

For effective implementation of the decisions taken by each association the student will be grouped into three houses and captains and vice - captains elected from each group shall act as leaders of the group.

The following Cells, Clubs and Associations will be constituted in the college:-

ANTI - RAGGING CELL

An anti- ragging cell is constituted in the college which strictly prohibits ragging of any kind within the premises of the college.

ANTI - SEXUAL HARASSMENT CELL

Our college has an Anti-Sexual Harassment Cell that follows UGC guidelines and the Higher Education Institution Act, 2013. The cell works to prevent, prohibit, and address sexual harassment and gender discrimination on campus. It also supports staff and students facing harassment outside the campus, especially during travel. Anyone found guilty of harassment will face severe consequences, including dismissal and police action.

ANTI - NARCOTIC CELL

College's Anti-Narcotic Cell aims to maintain a drug-free campus with the support of teachers, students, parents, and the entire college community. A vigilant committee has been established to execute the cell's functions and raise awareness about drug use. The cell educates students on the negative impacts of drug addiction, encourages peer policing, and reports any drug use. Given the rising concern of narcotics use in and around educational institutions, the cell emphasizes collaboration between teachers and parents to combat this issue. An anti-narcotic cell of students has been formed to support these efforts.

PLACEMENT & CAREER COUNSELING CELL

A placement and Career Counseling Cell functions in the college for intimating students of the college regarding job opportunities in various educational institutions and to arrange for campus interviews.

COUNSELLING CELL

Counselling services are provided to the needy students for enhancing their academic pursuits as well as for promoting mental health.

GRIEVANCE REDRESSAL CELL

Students can give written complaint to this cell directly or can put it in the suggestion box if they have any specific grievance or issue to be resolved. The complaints will be dealt with immediately and the committee under this cell would take necessary measures at the earliest.

WOMEN'S CELL

Women's cell aims at empowering and orienting women to recognize their true potential and to help them attain their own status in the changing world. Its goal is the overall development of women students in all walks of their life. Various activities of the women's cell will enhance self esteem and self confidence among women students. Such programmes also increase awareness related to social issues, health, employment and gender related issues.

INNOVATION AND ENTREPRENEURSHIP DEVELOPMENT CELL (IEDC)

IEDC aim to provide students an opportunity to experiment and innovate. It is a flagship initiative of Kerala Start Up Mission to promote innovation and entrepreneurship among the students and academic freternity in the education institutions in the state of Kerala and is considered as an umbrella programme that would play an instrumental role in fostering innovation culture in academic institutions.

TOURISM CLUB

A tourism club functions in the college to create better understanding about our country and its culture and to ensure more professionalism in all fields of tourism, The club organizes programmes to create awareness about monuments, geographical and cultural features etc.

NATURE CLUB

A nature club is set up in the college to promote environmental awareness and love for nature.
